BAM March Program: Bill Motzer, "Mercury Deposits of the California Coast Ranges and Their Environmental Impact"

In a pleasantly local program for the month, our scheduled speaker is Bill Motzer, PG, CHG. He is a member and frequent contributor to the Northern California Geological Society.

Many mineralogically-interested individuals may be surprised to learn that Northern California is splattered with mercury deposits and in the 19th century was a major producer of mercury in the US, especially for the processing of gold in the Sierra foothills.

Bill Motzer is a Senior Geologist with Todd Engineers and will give us a little context on where and why these deposits occur as well as their downstream environmental consequences.
