BAM June Program: Dennis Freiburger, "The Karakoram Highway"

This month we will have another guest speaker, Dennis Freiburger of the Contra Costa Gem & Mineral Society. His topic will be "The Karakoram Highway: A geography, gem, and mineral trip from Pakistan to Central Asia." Based on Dennis' 2001 trip from Islamabad to Kashgar, here's the good word on the presentation:

"Most people know the Karakoram for its high mountains and complex cultural / political situations. But most don't realize there is a spectacular 700 mile journey illustrating Earth Science at its best from Pakistan to far west China along the Karakoram Highway. The road winds amongst glaciers disappearing into deserts, mountains much more dangerous than Everest, and canyons several times deeper than our Grand Canyon. It is a region surprisingly rich in gems, minerals, and metamorphic rocks. People have been trekking to Asia and the Silk Road for thousands of years, but only recently can you drive the 'highway.' (Only for a few months each year - and then when sand storms, glaciers, landslides, earthquakes, and tribal bandits permit.)"

A presentation well worth catching, given how much less hospitable the region has grown over the past decade. Bring your favorite Pakistani material to share for show and tell!
