# BAM May Program: Don Windeler, "Minerals and Stamps"

Due to a few late changes in travel plans, Ted Hadley found he would not be able to make it for this month's regular slot. Rather than change the meeting date, we'll be hearing about Ted's mineral hunting adventures in SoCal next month. In his stead, your newsletter editor will be filling in with a program on a side interest of mine: minerals on postage stamps.

Stamps offer a vast array of options to the interested collector, with windows into history,

geography and just about any topic in which one might take an interest. And the hobby virtually forces one to find an area of focus, as it's essentially impossible to collect everything out there! (Think # countries x number of stamps issued /yr x # of years stamps have been around...)

I became involved in the hobby through osmosis, a result of looking for entertainment while at stamp shows with my wife. I started looking for mineral issues and found that with persistence one could develop an interesting collection for a relatively small amount of money. While not an especially active collector these days, the rock and mineral-related pages in our albums include well over 500 stamps from more than 50 countries.

This program represents a mix of philatelic fun related to minerals: a bit of background and history, along with a few stories and my own views on the good, the bad and the ugly in mineral stamps. In addition to the slides, there will be a few albums filled with worldwide examples and books on the topic. Rumour has it there may also be a few sets up for auction to benefit BAM as well.

## More CCMA Feedback and Tips

As discussed in our April meeting, a number of rockhounds from BAM and other clubs have already begun to take advantage of Clear Creek's reopening. As with last month, if you have been out there please let us know what's working and what's not. Word so far has been good regarding access and the permitting process, but not all roads and permutations have been checked out yet. If you are coming to the meeting, please be ready to share your experiences and tips on the permitting & access process with the group; if you can't be there, please send to President Spence at bill.spence777@sbcglobal.net.

President Spence also shared a tip that may be of value to those in the close-to-retired crowd: the Senior Pass for the federal park system. It is available to those who are 62 1/2 years old for a one-time, lifetime fee of \$10. It entitles one to avoid entrance and use fees at National Parks, Monuments and other federal recreation lands --including the \$5 entrance fee at CCMA. According to Bill, a person on the phone at Hollister says that the procedure is to record your card number (it's on the lower right front of the Senior Pass card) on the envelope at the iron gate in lieu of the \$5 deposit. Given that the

\$10 purchase price covers you for the rest of your life, it's well worth the investment.

### NCMA Coming Up!

Many BAM members participate in multiple mineral clubs and one of the most popular in the region is the NCMA (Northern California Mineralogical Association). The NCMA has a focus (pun intended) on micromounting, but like BAM includes many with a strong interest in the field of mineralogy and in personally-collected material.

Each year the NCMA holds a 3-day symposium that includes speakers, auctions, swaps and giveaway tables, with the last being well-known for the interesting materials that can be found. This year's edition will be held in El Dorado on May 30 – June 1.
