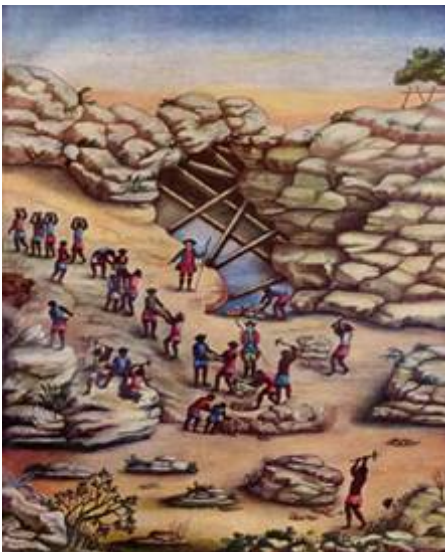

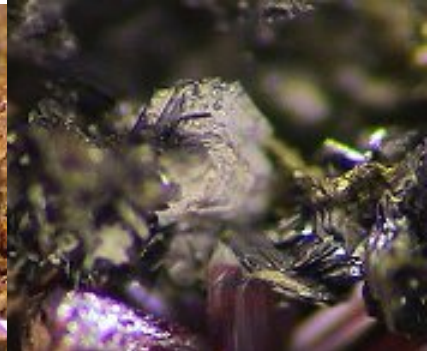
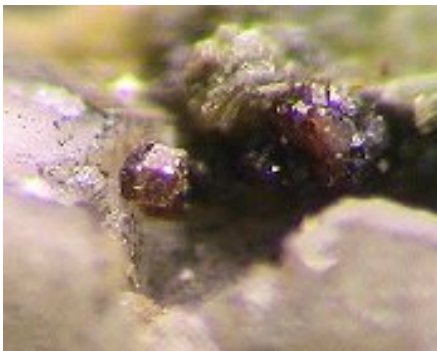
What's New?

New at the Denver Show: **Botryogen** in bladed whisky-orange crystals to over 2cm with Copiapite, Butlerite and Parabutlerite from Mina Santa Elena, Alcaparrosa, San Juan, Argentina, **Thompsonite** in attractive cream-colored spheres up to 6cm from a recent well-dig in the Aurangabad forest, near Nasik, Maharashtra State, India, **Pentagonite** from the Wagholi Quarry, Poona, India, **Menezesite**, from the Jacupiranga mine, Cajati, Sao Paulo, Brazil and named after famed & friendly mineral dealer Luis Menezes, **Wulfenite** from James R. Lee mine in Broadwater County, Montana, the extremely rare silver-mercury sulfosalt **Fettelite** with Proustite from the Imiter Mine, Dades Region, Anti-Atlas Mts., Morocco, Africa

New at the Munich Show: gem specimens of **Liddicoatite** to 2 cm in length from Madagascar, some incredibly glassy **Barite** from Cerro Warihuyn, Mir Aflores Huamllalias, Huanuco, Peru, Olive-colored **Carbonate-apatite** from the Sapo mine, Goiabeira, Aimorés, Rio Doce, Minas Gerais, Brazil
