The Clear Creek area of San Benito County has been a traditional site for BAM members to meet for mineral collecting for decades. Each year, our plan will be to hold the final, official BAM field trip in this area to wrap up a great year of collecting. This year's finale is on October 9 and 10. If you can join us, meet at Staging Stop #3 (or possibly #4, I'm not positive), marked <u>"Indian Flat" at 8am, Saturday morning, the 9th.</u> The area is well marked and is the trail head for Victor Claim, about a half mile hike up the creek drainage. We will visit at least three other locations (you have to be there to find out which ones) that are classic collecting sites in this area. Easy directions: From Gilroy, California, on Highway 101, proceed to Hollister on Highway 25 south. Go past "The Pinnacles" National Monument on Highway 25 until you reach the "Clear Creek BLM Site." Take the turn off from the highway and proceed along Clear Creek Road to "Indian Flat, Staging Stop 3 or 4", cross the creek and meet us.
