Theft at the State Mining & Mineral Museum

Sad news from Mariposa: for those who haven't heard, on September 29, the California State Mining & Mineral Museum was robbed of a significant lot of mineral specimens. The thieves threatened employees and broke into three cases filled with historical gold and mineral specimens; exact counts of what was taken are not known, but it's estimated at over \$2 million worth.

Another rough turn of events for the museum – as discussed in past BAM meetings, it has been on the verge of losing its state funding and just recently received a temporary, two-year reprieve. One can just hope that some of California's history can be recovered before it's melted down into scrap.
